A coordinated relief and recovery funding application process to provide assistance to nonprofit organizations whose facilities, services and clients have been impacted by a disaster.

- Common online application for agencies to complete
- Announcement shared by all funders within 48 hours after a disaster
- Collaborative application review process for funders
- Grant awards made directly to agencies by the funder
- Summary report of applications received and funded
