

### Percentage of Cost Burdened Households by MSA (FL) - 2019 EST (Cost Burden Threshhold - 30%)







#### Cohorts of People Experiencing Homelessness






# Primary Causes of Cost Burden and Who Is Most Affected

- Primary Causes:
  - Insufficient Wages
  - High housing costs
- Who is Most Cost-Burdened
  - Renters
  - Households earning 50% of AMI or less

Planning + Financing + Long-Term Assurances = Affordability

  - Teachers, police officer, firefighters, healthcare workers
- What jobs and income levels make up most of the actual "Workforce"?








#### Wages and Housing Costs by MSA



#### MSAs in Florida with BLS Data




Median Income of Top 10 Most Common Occupations in Wage Needed to Florida







